

# WORKSHOP ON NEW SOER 2024-1 “LEADERSHIP IN PREVENTING FATALITIES AND SEVERE INJURIES”

26<sup>th</sup> – 28<sup>th</sup> November 2024, Forum Oskarshamn

**The Workshop is organised by WANO Paris Centre in collaboration with Oskarshamn NPP/SNP, Sweden.**

## Background

Shortfalls in Industrial Safety have a potential to lead to the most severe consequences and adverse effects such as fatalities and permanent injuries. Moreover, these effects reduce the confidence of the regulator and the general public. Understanding why these events occur and identifying where the main weaknesses are is the key to prevent them from happening.

On a global scale, significant events continue to occur in nearly all categories. The 2030 Actions for Excellence (AfE) goals, in particular goal 3, states that there will be no significant events by 2030.

Despite significant efforts of WANO members, fatalities and injuries that result in permanent disabilities continue to occur at stations at all four regional centres, with no indication that the trend is improving.

The inability to provide a safe work environment free from fatalities erodes regulator and general public confidence in our ability to follow basic industrial safety rules and jeopardises confidence in following rules as applied to nuclear and radiological safety. Lessons learned from industry events along with the lack of progress in eliminating fatalities across the nuclear industry provide the bases for this SOER.

## Objectives

The workshop offers a platform to the WANO members, to better understand the recommendations described in the new SOER. This with the aim that the WANO members have a better understanding to closely review this WANO SOER in light of their own plant procedures, policies, behaviors, practices and design to determine how this operating experience can be applied at their plants to further improve safety.

The workshop also offers a platform for experience exchange for the WANO members about their situation and strategies to improve in industrial safety among all nuclear professionals on all levels. It should give the opportunity to learn from each other how to improve and receive a better understanding of integrated industrial safety, how to address the issues on short, medium and long terms and implement an effective risk management culture.



### Topics

The workshop covers the following:

- How does the SOER 2024-1 support the station in addressing the risks in daily work and helps in mitigation of industrial risk? This include planning and implementation of tasks by station and contractor staff.

The scope of the workshop is focused on the 4 main drivers identified in the SOER 2024-1:

- Management leadership and support
- Oversight and supervision
- Work practices
- Sharing operating experience to improve performance

### Break-Out Sessions

Breakout sessions will be used to allow time for structured interaction with colleagues and to identify potential improvements for their organisations and to get insights in experienced and implementations.

### Target group

The workshop is open for all WANO PC members. Through sharing information, WANO and member presentations, each delegate is asked to take away improvements to adapt and implement at the own station.

The main target group for attending are Maintenance managers, Work Management Mangers, Industrial Safety managers/leaders on site and corporate level. Other functions involved in / or driving change within industrial safety and who are responsible for the implementation of this SOER, are also welcome. Managers and staff that are involved in the preparation and implementation of the work

Participants will be invited to share their experience on this topic.

### **Presentations from the participants**

For the best learning from each other, it would be very beneficial for all the participants to have delegates describing an event that they have had, and especially how they resolved it and what the wider learning was.

The time of presentation is 20 minutes including discussions.
